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
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However, there is one part that probably needs an explanation – the double SS. This is to retain a connection to our history and our previous name, Sunshine.

SUPPORTED INDEPENDENT LIVING (SIL)

What is Supported Independent Living?


Supported Independent Living (SIL) is an NDIS support also known as shared living accommodation.

SIL is where a person with disability can choose to live with other people and share common household areas in a modern, accessible share house. Through Unisson's person-centred active support approach, we support your choices and ensure that assistance is available when needed for daily tasks, such as cleaning, cooking, and personal care within your home.

Our SIL accommodation is located across:

- Sydney's Upper and Lower North Shore and Northern Beaches
- Western Sydney
- Central Coast
- The Hunter
- Port Stephens

Accommodation includes adapted homes in the community and purpose-built Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA), and ranges from shared homes with 3-4 bedrooms to separate self-contained units.



Planning your successful move

Together, we'll agree on a plan that works for everyone when you move house. Some of the things we'll consider include:

- Location/type of home separate or shared accommodation and proximity to your family, community facilities and public transport.
- The supports you require together we will discuss Shared/Supported Independent Living (SIL) with daytime or 24/7 active support, or Supported Living (drop-in support) and the facilities you require (e.g. accessibility) - taking into consideration what your future needs might be.
- Who you'll live with We take compatibility seriously! We will make sure your new roomies are on the same page as you when it comes to interests, routines and of course personality! You will have plenty of chances to meet them before any move is organised.
- **Your support staff** the skills and shared interests you'd like and need them to have.
- Any special **equipment or furniture** you'll need.
- How you'd like to **decorate** your home.
- Planning how we can best work alongside you to prepare you for the move.

Once your requirements are documented, the experience becomes more exciting and enjoyable and you can start visiting potential properties and meeting potential housemates!

Usually, it takes around 3 to 6 months to find and move into your new home. You may choose to continue with your current living arrangements, with the peace of mind that you have plans in place to meet your future accommodation goals when the timing and property

After you've moved into your new home, our time is spent getting to know you even better, to understand what you need and want to be able to live your best life. We'll continue to review, discuss and check in with you and your support networks.

SPECIALIST DISABILITY ACCOMMODATION (SDA)

What is Specialist Disability Accommodation?

Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) is innovative, accessible housing specifically designed for people with functional impairment or very complex support needs. SDA is designed to support people with specific housing needs to live a more independent and fulfilling life while accessing high-quality Supported Independent Living.

We understand the challenges people face when it comes to finding suitable and appropriate accommodation, especially when someone has more specific housing needs.

Based on our core values, Unisson have strategically partnered with a number of Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) providers to bring you brand new purpose-built, accessible homes designed to suit your support needs.

Our SDA partnerships make it possible for people to exercise choice and control over where they live, who they live with and how they live. This creates a sense of belonging and a place for you to truly call home.

Unisson & DPN Casa Capace

In partnership with DPN Casa Capace, we have designed an exceptional SDA home that offers flexibility to accommodate residents with different support needs in the peaceful suburb of Tarro. With the residents in mind, this purpose-built home offers functionality, accessibility, and durability – allowing residents with more specific housing needs to live how they want to, in a beautiful and modern space.

This new property features two separate dwellings, each dwelling comprising of three bedrooms, each with a connecting private ensuite. Other features include:

- Home features selected by you We invite our residents to be involved in selecting personal design elements of their new home.
- Located in an established community: The new property in Tarro is in close proximity to local shops, parks, restaurants, transportation and hospitals.
- Contemporary living: This home brings hand-picked, curated interiors and colour palettes, fixtures and finishes to give you a calm, luxury feel.

We have more SDA partnerships in the works for this year and beyond - watch this space!

SHORT-TERM ACCOMMODATION (STA)

What is Short-Term Accommodation?

Our STA service supports people with disability to have a short stay away from their usual home, while providing planned respite for families caring for a person with disability. Our service is flexible and designed to be responsive to each family's unique circumstances.

From a few hours to a few weeks, at home, or away!

Whether you choose to tap into our STA service for a few hours a week over the whole year, or use your STA funding to plan for a holiday, our goal is to be available for you, whatever your needs. We can arrange for our trained staff to come to you, to support you at home* or you may prefer to plan a break at our holiday cottage, in the leafy yet cosmopolitan suburb of Hornsby, in Sydney's north.

Whether at home or away, we'll work with you and your family to plan activities and experiences that you'll enjoy.

Take a break at our holiday cottage

Close to public transport, shops, cafés, restaurants, and beautiful national parks, our Hornsby holiday cottage and friendly trained staff provide overnight accommodation and 24/7 support for people with an intellectual disability and/or high physical support needs**.

Our cottage provides a homely, holiday-like environment. Prior to your stay, we'll work with you and your family to plan activities and experiences that you'll enjoy and that meet your individual needs and preferences. Some guests choose to continue some of their regular activities (e.g. Community Access day programs, work or other commitments) during their stay, while others prefer to take a complete break. During your stay you'll have the opportunity to participate in fun, social incursions and excursions, make new friends and try new activities.

What Is Supported Living?

Supported Living (otherwise known as drop-in support), gives you flexibility and control over the type and level of support you receive, ensuring you get the support you need, when you need it. This may be during the day, evening, weekdays or on the weekend.

Whether you live on your own, with family or friends, our drop-in support can assist you to live independently, plus our training can help you to become more independent or prepare to transition your living arrangement in the future.

We'll work with you, your family and support network to plan the right type and amount of support for you to meet your goals.

The support we provide is flexible and tailored to meet your individual needs and goals, whether you'd like one-to-one or small group support in the community or prefer to attend one of our community access day programs - or both!

COMMUNITY-BASED SUPPORT

We can assist you to take part in activities that you enjoy, giving you the opportunity to meet and spend time with people who share your interests. As our approach is also to match a Direct Support Professional with you based on your shared interests, we're sure you'll enjoy your time together and have plenty to talk about!

For example, things we can organise together include outings to the cinema, park or museum, special events, watching and playing sport, shopping, joining a hobby group or club, volunteering and activities focused around health and wellbeing.



HUB-BASED SUPPORT

Do you enjoy spending time with others, going on outings, staying active and having fun?


Our Community Access hubs are an ideal base where you can catch up and relax with friends, go on planned excursions! You'll have the opportunity to learn new skills and participate in fun, social incursions and excursions, make new friends and try new activities.

Each day is different. We'll work with you to choose and plan your participation in activities and experiences that meet your individual needs and preferences.

Our hubs provide comfortable, welcoming environments and multipurpose spaces to suit a range of activities, including quiet spaces where you can unwind after a busy day. Some of our hubs have dedicated multisensory rooms and have been custom designed for accessibility and to meet the needs of clients with complex physical support needs.

GOING ON HOLIDAY

We all look forward to a break, where we can relax, engage our interests, socialise and explore new places – holidays are, after-all, a part of 'ordinary life'. But did you know that your NDIS plan can fund the support you'll need to travel or go on holiday?

The NDIS can provide funding for the 'reasonable and necessary' supports you require during your trip, such as a Direct Support Professional, hire of a disability vehicle and disability equipment, a surcharge for accommodation fitted with disability supports and Auslan interpretation services. NDIS funding does not cover the cost of any flights, hotels, food, entertainment and spending money.

If going on holiday is one of your goals, you can request for it to be added to your NDIS plan at your next plan review meeting. If you have Support Coordination in your plan, your Support Coordinator will assist you to arrange supports and/or source a holiday that aligns with your goals and offers good value.

Some examples of supported travel and holidays include:

- Going on holiday with your family or attending a family event, e.g. a wedding
- Travelling to and attending a work conference, concert or sporting event
- Going on a personalised or package holiday
- Going on a group holiday







Blue Apple Art Studios is a collaborative art space in Terrey Hills, nestled in a tranquil, leafy, private setting.

This light-filled, modern and accessible art space is a place for people of all abilities, ages, and experience to explore their creativity.

Specialising in a range of mediums, our Art Facilitators teach techniques to develop your skills in ceramics, paper making, painting and drawing in a supportive and social environment, designed to ignite your creative passions. You'll also have opportunities to participate in community art exhibitions.



ART

Immerse yourself in the experience of painting, drawing, collage and printmaking. Explore your creativity using a wide range of materials and techniques including acrylic and watercolour painting, relief printing and drawing with pencils, charcoal and oil pastels. Artists are encouraged to awaken an alternate way of perceiving using observation and emotion to uncover their creative expression. Classes are individualised, so you can create whatever your heart desires!



PAPERMAKING

Enter the world of hand-made papers, where you'll learn the ancient art of paper making from start to finish! You will learn basic pulp paper making and a variety of techniques to create beautiful finished handmade paper paintings, cards and three-dimensional artworks.



CERAMICS

Prepare to get hands-on with the tactile medium of clay. Let your creativity run free as you enter the world of pottery, for clay is as deep and as broad as the earth that it comes from, so the opportunities are endless!

Whatever your skill level, you can create beautiful and functional items from clay. Our experienced Art Facilitators will guide you through creating a simple pinch pot to more adventurous projects such as a planter pot, bowl set or creative sculpture. The options are endless!

Friday Creative Social Group

These small group sessions are for people who identify as artists or who want to work on specific art projects in a creative and social environment. QUACK-ERS ABOUTART

For talented, award-winning artist and disability spokesperson Venessa Crane, art is an integral part of her daily life. For the past three years she's been attending Unisson's art classes where she's been supported to hone her techniques and style.

When she began classes with Unisson, Venessa was already an accomplished artist, but she was intrigued by the diverse range of mediums offered and the opportunity to work with art professionals and fellow artists.

"I'm very much into variety and exploring different mediums and I'm hoping to get a feel for what I like," says Venessa.

Venessa's work includes multiple stylistic genres from the playful to the more traditional, including a solo exhibition of her portraits, but she's best known for her prolific duck artworks inspired by Donald Duck. Venessa has great affection for Donald that goes beyond his cute and humorous side.

"As a child I liked his quirky personality," she says. "He's very determined and he does get a bit hot under the collar with frustration sometimes and I can see that in myself as well."

Venessa's recent works include a new character, QuackStar. Although still under development,Vanessa shared that he's a duck with beautiful, fluorescent, rainbow wings and, as QuackStar is her own creation, she will be able to sell her artworks.

"I'm extending myself at the moment. I'm doing a few designs of another duck... and I've started a sculpture of a duck with rainbow wings," she says.

Venessa was thrilled when, in early 2020, Unisson's three art studios merged to become the Blue Apple studio and moved to new custom-designed premises in Terrey Hills. As well as having floor to ceiling windows with excellent natural light and a bush outlook (and the occasional passing duck), all the art facilitators are within the same space at the same time and it's easy to move between art mediums and to connect with other artists.

"She sees the same people each time, so they build up a rapport, and she comes with a really lovely support worker who feels like another member of the team," says Unisson Art Coordinator Heidi Fergusson.

"I absolutely love it!" says Venessa. "It's nice to have collaboration from everybody. I really look forward to coming."

SUPPORT COORDINATION

What is Support Coordination?

Unisson has helped many people to prepare, manage and review their NDIS Plans – maximising their hours of support and enabling them to live the life they choose. And we've developed a great reputation and relationship with the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA), based on our extensive resources and efficient service.

Unisson's Support Coordinators have an in-depth knowledge of the NDIS and can support you to achieve a high quality NDIS plan. They will work with you to:

- Determine your individual wants, needs and goals and also consider what your future needs and goals might be, so you can proactively plan ahead.
- Navigate the NDIS marketplace to find and present to you a range of supports that you can access in your current plan that are best suited to meeting your needs and goals and provide value for money for your plan budget.
- Contact and communicate with service providers of your choice to source quotes and complete service agreements and bookings. They will monitor your plan usage, thereafter, to ensure that your NDIS funds continue to be used effectively.
- Monitor and record your progress towards achieving your goals to demonstrate the need for ongoing or future supports.
- Produce an NDIS Plan Review Report and help you to prepare for your Plan Review meeting, provide support during the meeting and respond to any requests for additional information after the meeting.
- Provide support with plan changes and appeals, e.g.
 to request additional funding if funding is insufficient
 or request changes to your plan or a Plan Review to
 access additional supports in the event of a change
 of circumstances.
- Assist you to build capacity and exercise choice and control, e.g. by mentoring and teaching you how to use the NDIS portal, monitor budgets and find providers.

SPECIALIST SUPPORTS SEE DARRIN FLOURISH

Getting the most out of your NDIS plan can be a complicated and confusing task to tackle on your own. However, for Darrin, connecting with his Support Coordinator Ros has meant a whole array of support services have become available and he is seeing positive outcomes.

For Darrin, a key goal was increasing his independent living skills, particularly developing his skillset and confidence in the kitchen. Ros connected Darrin with Chefs That Care, a specialist NDIS service provider running adapted in-home cooking classes for people with disability. Chefs That Care founder, Jake, is a former professional chef and has been visiting Darrin in his home for their one-to-one cooking classes each week.

"Darrin is such a friendly and capable man," says Jake.
"We've been working on the importance of healthy
foods, learning achievable recipes and how to safely
use sharp knives, graters and other cooking tools and
utensils. We've also focussed on how to safely operate
a hot stove and oven, as well as increasing Darrin's
knowledge of food safety."

And within only a few weeks Darrin's confidence and cooking skills have flourished. "I love cooking with Jake," says Darrin. "I like being able to make my favourite foods and learn new recipes."
